



Summer Term - we all go travelling by

This term we aim to learn about various ways different people travel around the world, how things are moved around and how transport affects the things we have and use in everyday life.

We hope to embed the belief and understanding that animals are still important in many places in the world as means of transport; considering camels, donkeys or mules, and elephants. Also learning how working dogs pull sleighs in snowy and icy climates.

Life is a journey, but how do we get from A to B? We all travel, every day, in order to do everything. We use our feet to move around the house (or a wheelchair), or a bicycle, car or scooter to get to school or work. Transport is a crucial part of our everyday lives and one that we often take for granted. It is vital to teach children how to be safe on and around roads. The increase in traffic in recent decades has meant increased danger to pedestrians and others that use the roads. We will teach the children how to be safe in fun ways; through role-play and in the playground with the bikes and wheeled vehicles.

Monday 15th May- Friday 19th May we are asking the children to bring in scooters, bikes, scuttlebugs and other modes of transport they use to travel around Sandbach. To show their friends and talk about the similarities and differences between them and the importance of road safety.

Young children can be naturally inquisitive, wanting to know how things work and what things do. Many children are fascinated by vehicles and forms of transport, such as trucks, diggers, cars, trains, buses or aeroplanes.

We will practice our numeracy skills by counting as many forms of transport as we can, compare their size, shapes and colour and talk about where they may be travelling to and what they're transporting.

A topic on transport is a fantastic starting point for inviting children to talk about their own experiences. Please use this topic at home to reinforce their learning, catch a bus, look out for diggers on local construction sites, look for horses, or trucks and aeroplanes. There are also numbers to be found on trains, planes and buses, looking out for these numbers could be fun for the children and a great learning opportunity.

If possible please could you sing these songs at home with your children
